

St Ives Interprint Competition Rules 2026

- 1. All rules must be adhered to non-compliance in any respect will result in all of that Club's work being excluded from the Competition.
- 2. The Competition is to be known as the "St Ives Interprint Competition".
- 3. The Competition is held annually and is open to Clubs which are members of The East Anglian Federation of Photographic Societies, or are based within a 100 mile radius of St Ives (Cambridgeshire) and are affiliated to The Photographic Alliance of Great Britain as a member of another Federation. Entries will be accepted in the order of receipt, up to a maximum of 30 Clubs.
- 4. The 2026 Competition will be held on Saturday 26th February in the St Ives Free Church. St Ives Photographic Club (hereinafter SIPC) shall provide an independent PAGB-accredited judge.
- 5. Each Club shall enter 6 prints, which shall be marked as individual prints and not as a Panel. SIPC encourages Clubs to showcase their best work in this Competition. Prints may be monochrome, colour or a combination of both. This is an open Competition and all genres of photography may be entered.
- 6. No more than 2 prints may be the work of any one Photographer who, in turn, may represent only one Club.
- 7. All prints must be mounted, with the Photographer's name, Club, print title, and number (1-6) on the back.
- 8. The minimum print surface area is 300 cm^2 with one side at least 20 cm long. The maximum print size, including the mount, shall not exceed $40 \times 50 \text{ cm}$. Any border surrounding the printed image will not be considered when determining the print size.
- 9. A Club must not enter prints which are identical or substantially similar to prints entered by that Club in any previous St Ives *Interprint* competition.
- 10. Images must be entirely the work of the Photographer. In composite images, all component elements must meet this requirement. For the avoidance of doubt, use of images from any other source including, but not limited to, royalty free image banks and clipart is not permitted.
- 11. Where manipulation or adjustment has been applied, this must have been carried out by the photographer of the original image(s). Techniques such as cloning or Content-aware Fill, using data from the Photographer's original image(s), are permitted. Techniques such as Generative Fill, using data or content from elsewhere, are covered by Rule 10 and are not permitted.



- 12. Participating Clubs are to provide a digital version of each submitted print. Digital images should be from the same file as that from which the print was produced, and should conform to SIPC's guidance notes on the preparation of digital images which will be provided to all participating Clubs.
- 13. Digital images will be used as a point of reference for the judge and audience during the evening results and awards presentations, but they will not affect the marking in any way. For prints not produced digitally or for which a digital file is not received, then SIPC reserves the right to make a digital copy of the print for this purpose.
- 14. Entries, prints and supporting digital images must be sent to arrive by the due date, which will be advised separately.
- 15. SIPC will take every care to avoid damage or loss to any prints in their care but cannot accept any responsibility, under any circumstances, for loss or damage to the prints.
- 16. The St Ives *Interprint* Cup was donated by Mark Pink ARPS and, while awarded to the winning Club (ie the Club receiving the highest total score), shall remain the property of SIPC. The winning Club shall retain the cup until the closing date for entries to the following year's competition and shall be responsible for:
 - a) The engraving of the Cup.
 - b) The safe keeping of the Cup whilst in the Club's possession.
 - c) The safe and timely return of the Cup to SIPC.
- 17. There will also be awards for the authors of the best individual prints, as selected by the Judge.
- 18. The judge's decision is final.
- 19. Participating Clubs are responsible for collecting their own entries at the end of the competition or enclosing any relevant postage and packaging.
- 20. SIPC will retain a copy of each digital image entry in its database for future reference and display on its website; the images of the award-winning prints may also be used, with credit to the respective Photographers, in publicity and in the programme for the subsequent year's competition. Photographers not wishing their images to be used in this way should inform the *Interprint* Secretary in writing, through their Club, before the event. Digital images will not be reproduced in any other way or passed to any third party without the express permission of the author.
